From the President's Desk.....

Trout season is about to open with some of the lowest spring stream flows on record. Prospects for catching wild fish will diminish as the low clear water will help announce the arrival of even the stealthiest of anglers. Hopefully the hatches will appear in numbers, but often low water mutes hatching activity as well. It should prove to be a very trying spring if we do not get some much-needed rain.

The chapter has partnered with the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy to apply for a Growing Greener II grant which will be used to repair some of the stream bank in the Class A section of the Perkiomen, and also provide additional vegetation along Walters Creek. We should hear from the grant sources by July.

Existing **restoration** sites need some maintenance in the form of multi-flora rose removal, planting of native shrubs, and some fence repair. We will ask you to step forward on **April 22 (Earth Day)** to give some time that morning to help with these tasks.

The chapter has also formed a working group with other partners to submit stream classification upgrades throughout the upper Perkiomen. According to biological data supplied by the Stroud Water Research Center, the Perkiomen and many of its tributaries possess a healthy and diverse population of aquatic insects and other macro-invertebrates. The existence of these may support a classification of "Exceptional Value" by the state and would mean further protec-

tions for our watershed.

Our first ever fly fishing mentoring classes are about to conclude. Four students were taught about choosing equipment, tying knots, fly tying, and casting. They will be guided on stream sections on **May 13th**, the day of our annual **creel survey and picnic**. Other anglers who want to assist with the survey and attend the picnic are welcome to join us. The picnic will be in the early afternoon following the creel survey.

On **April 17th** (see calendar) the final spring program for the year will be offered by **'Ozzie' Ozefovich**, titled *Feeding Lies*. You will see some dramatic underwater video of trout behavior in feeding stations. This will help you understand what the trout are taking, which stage of the hatch they are taking and what to do in multiple-hatch situations. See previews at www.underwateroz.com. This event will be combined with our annual Spring Conservation Raffle. We have many great door prizes for this event, including a Cabela's smoker/grill valued at over \$250! Please join us.

Speaking of joining, the annual chapter trip to the Upper Woods Pond is scheduled for June 16, 17, and 18. 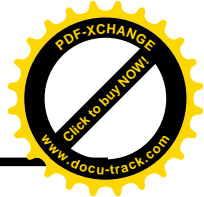
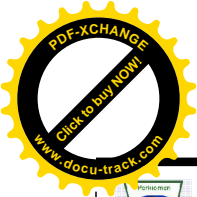
- **Grand Prize:** Orvis T3 8'6" 5 Weight Rod with a Ross Cimarcon Reel
